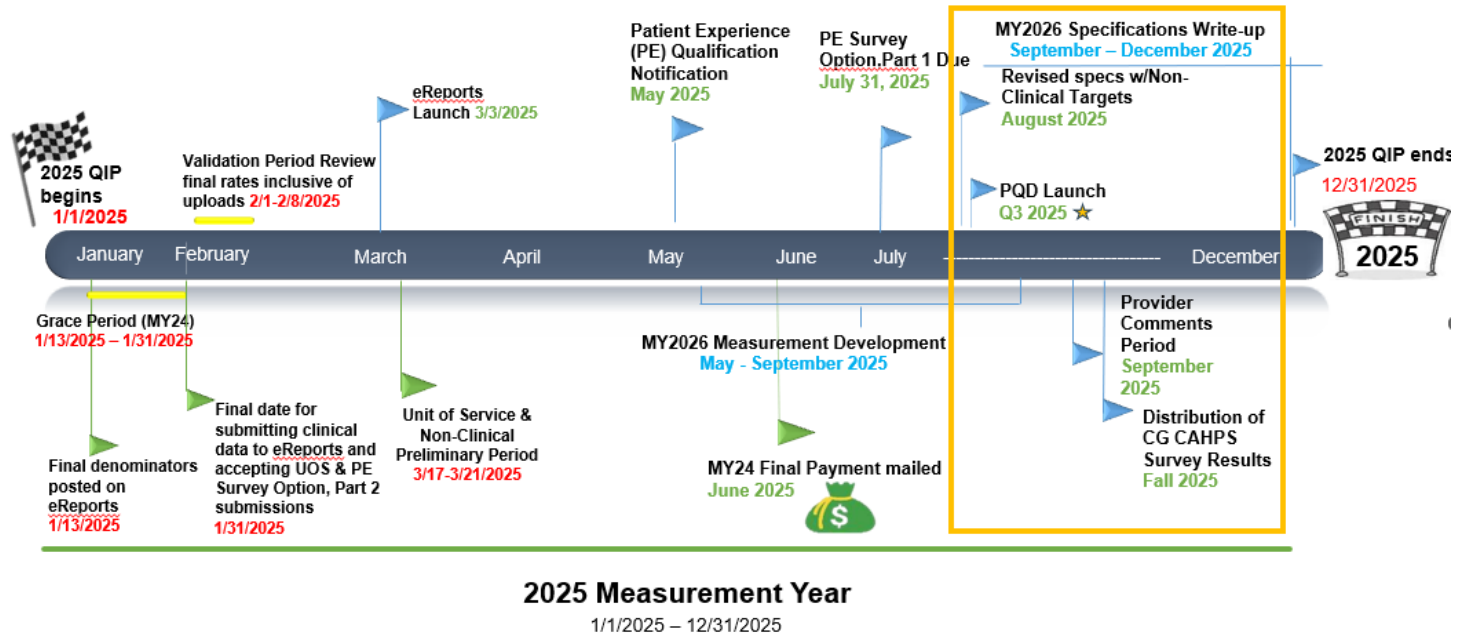
- **MY2025 PCP QIP Recorded Webinars** are available on our [webpage](#).
- **Partnership's new core claims system, Health Rules Payor (HRP)** – tentative go-live has been delayed. A new launch date is pending.
- **2025 Partnership Quality Dashboard (PQD) Launch** – exact date will be determined in Quarter 3 of 2025.
- **2025 Non-Clinical Targets** – 2025 PCP QIP Specifications have been updated to include the targets for non-clinical measures. **Please note:** The non-clinical code set has been removed from the PCP QIP webpage and is in the process of being moved to eReports. If you require a copy of the non-clinical code set, please reach out to the QIP team at QIP@partnershiphp.org
- **MY2026 Measure Development Provider Review Period** – Providers will be able to review the proposed changes to the measurement set for MY2026 and provide feedback for consideration. Notifications to providers will be sent out in early fall.
- **Electronic Clinical Data Systems (ECDS) is a Unit of Service (UOS) measure**
 - Parent organization who signs an agreement with DataLink to allow the extraction of HEDIS data by September 30, 2025 for full part 1 incentive. Agreements signed after September 30, 2025 will be eligible for half part 1 payment.
 - DataLink receives HEDIS data abstraction successfully from parent organization's EMR by October 31, 2025, and the parent organization responds in a timely manner to requests for verification in order to receive the full part 2 incentive. Providers who require assistance from their EMR for data extraction can earn partial incentive (\$1,500) for set-up if the data extraction does not take place during the same measurement year. The other partial incentive (\$1,500) can be earned during the measurement year of when the data extraction has been successfully completed.

Please note: This is a one-time UOS incentive. If your parent organization participates in both the PCP and Perinatal QIP, please advise both programs for eligibility towards earning the Perinatal QIP incentive and UOS incentive in the PCP QIP.

MY2025 Measure Changes and Specifications Updates:

- **Electronic Clinical Data Systems (ECDS) unit of service measure:**
 1. Additional criteria for providers who require assistance from their EMR for their data extraction.
 2. Updated note for notification if participating in both PCP QIP and Perinatal QIP.
- **Small Denominator:** Added best practice for submission process.
- **Hospital Follow-up within 7 days After Discharge:** Updated denominator criteria for the look-back date span

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Microlearning: ePrompts and Preventive Care Reports



Unlock New Skills in Minutes: Fast, Focused Learning with Microlearnings

These short, focused modules deliver key concepts in bite-sized, easily digestible formats – perfect for busy schedules and quick access when needed. These new microlearnings are designed to empower staff in closing preventive care gaps for your patients.

ePrompts is a tool within Provider Online Services that allows provider office staff to quickly access Partnership members' clinical preventive screenings that are due while checking their eligibility. This streamlined feature ensures that staff can efficiently identify screenings needed for each member, improving workflow, and enhancing patient care by ensuring timely preventive services.

Through ePrompts, front office staff can view the member's current preventive screenings and well visits, such as:	
Breast Cancer Screening	Colorectal Cancer Screening
Cervical Cancer Screening	Diabetes - HbA1c
Child and Adolescent Well-Care Visits	Retinal Eye Exam

Preventive Care Reports is a tool in eReports that tracks patients who are due or will be due for pediatric immunizations and well-child visits. The report helps staff ensure timely care and improves patient engagement by keeping children up to date on their well-care. This report also helps identify patterns and trends in immunization and well visit rates for staff to utilize in driving performance strategies and targeted interventions.

ABCs of Quality Improvement (QI) is an in-person training designed to teach you the basic principles of quality improvement using the *Model for Improvement*. This interactive course introduces key concepts and practical tools to help you drive meaningful change in your work.

The course covers the following topics:

- What is quality improvement?
- Introduction to the Model for Improvement
- How to create an aim statement (project goal)
- How to use data to measure quality and drive improvement
- Tips for developing change ideas that lead to improvement
- Testing changes with the Plan-Do-Study-Act (PDSA) cycle

Who Should Attend? This course is designed for clinicians, practice managers, quality improvement team members, and staff who are responsible for participating in and leading quality improvement efforts within their organization.
